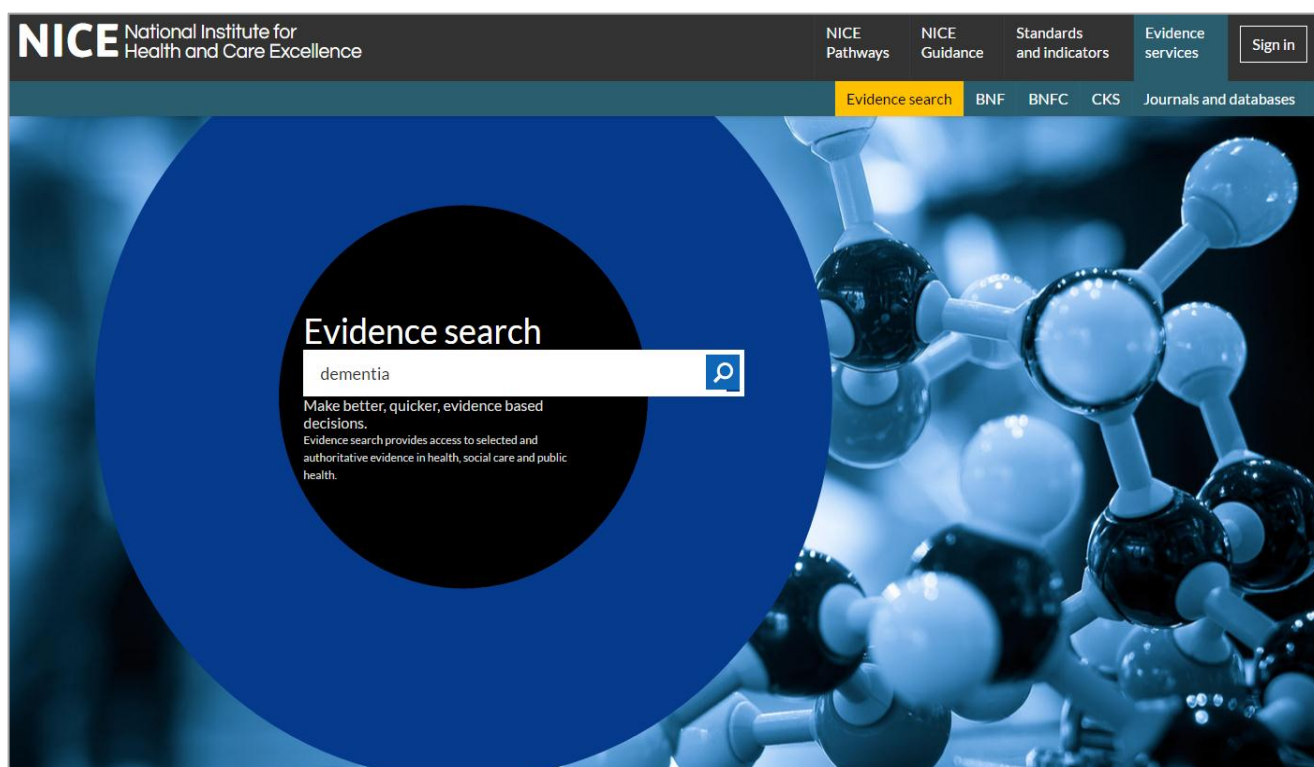
NICE Evidence Search and Trip are search engines for authoritative health information.

NICE Evidence Search

“NICE Evidence Search allows you to retrieve evidence-based information from key clinical, non-clinical and social care sources with a single search.”

NICE Evidence Search is a good resource for guidelines, reports and some systematic reviews. It is not the place to search for journal articles (please see the 'Searching Healthcare Databases' handout for information on searching for journal articles).



To search, enter your search term(s) into the search box and click on the blue search icon.

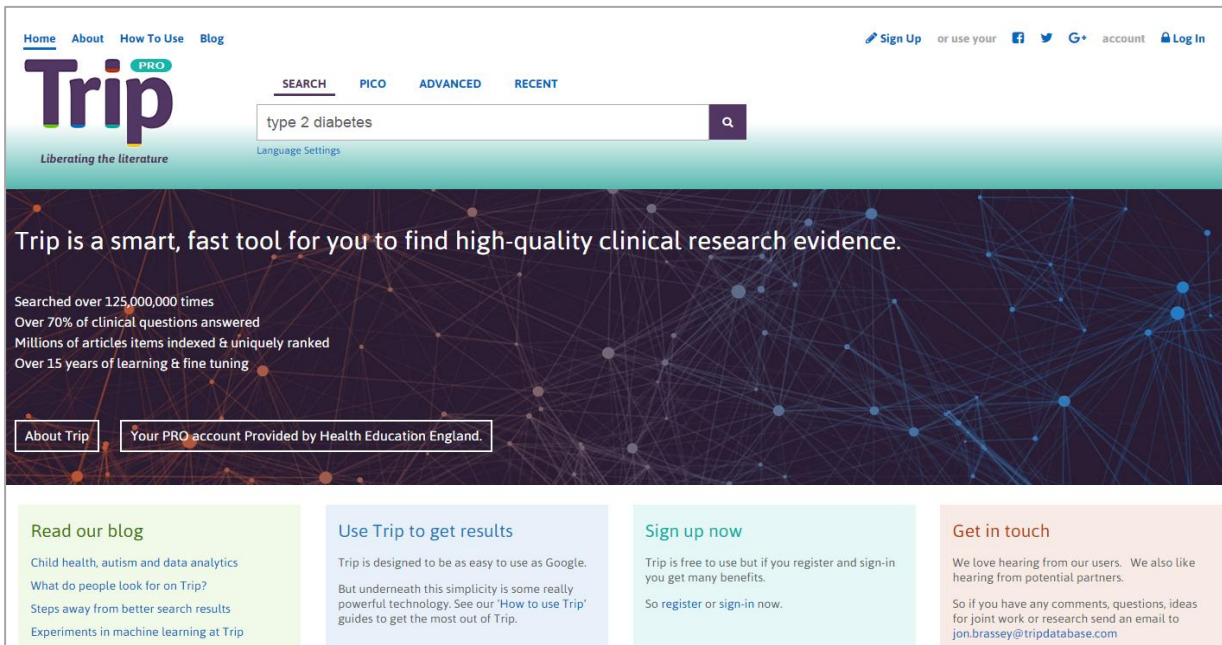

TRIP

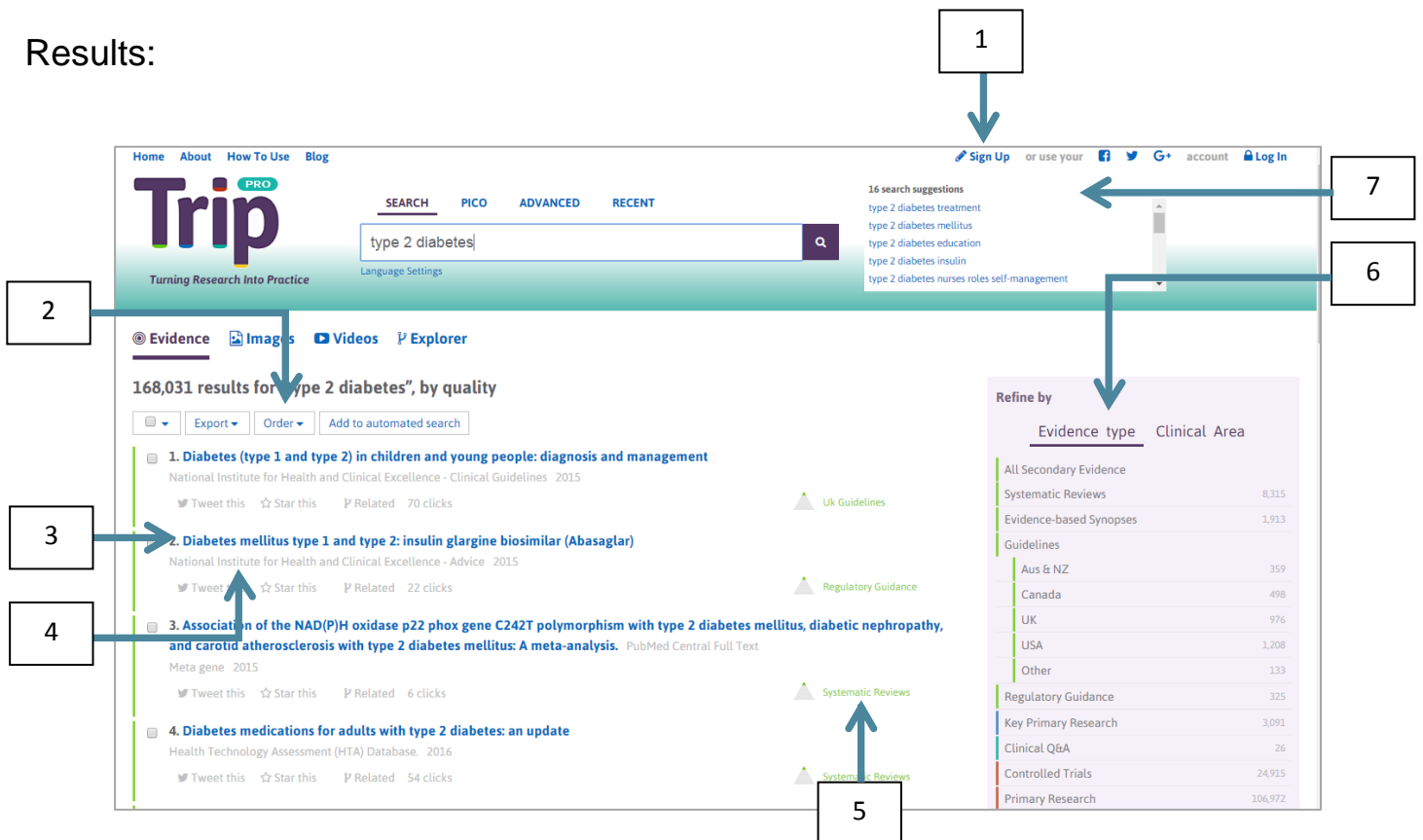
“Trip is a clinical search engine designed to allow users to quickly and easily find and use high-quality research evidence to support their practice and/or care.”

Trip is useful for resources such as guidelines, systematic reviews and clinical trials. It is not the best place to search for journal articles (please see the ‘Searching Healthcare Databases’ handout for information on searching for journal articles).



Enter your terms into the search box and click search. You also have advanced and PICO search options which may help guide your search.

Key:

1. Sign-up for a free Trip account. If you search Trip whilst logged in your searches will be automatically saved for future reference
2. Order your search by quality (default), date or relevance
3. Result title
4. Result source
5. Type of result colour coded for quality
6. Results can be filtered by level of evidence. Filter options in green are considered to be the most reliable. Alternatively filter by clinical area.
7. Search term suggestions
